Why choose a career in education and teaching?

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Teachers who come with grassroots experience and can provide students with the knowledge, skills and inspiration are greatly needed throughout the education system.

Employment Security

The Ministry of Education offers the high level of employment security that is typical of the public sector - well above the norm in the private sector.

• Diverse roles and opportunities for growth

Educators enjoy regular in-service training and have the opportunity for promotions in a wide range of positions within the education system.

M. Teach for English teachers

The M.Teach master program for English teachers in secondary schools trains graduates to teach English as a foreign language at a 5 unit study level and prepare students for the matriculation exam. Beit Berl College is the only academic institution in Israel to offer this innovative program!

Benefits and scholarships

Benefits and scholarships for students who are admitted to the program can total up to 52,000 NIS, including tuition fees and living stipends.

Scope and structure of studies

The studies entail 66 hours per week over a period of two year, including practice teaching (not including additional subject courses).

First year studies:

- Full day of studies (Monday)
- One day of practice teaching
- Additional subject courses per student's individual study plan.

Admission Requirements

- An average of at least 80 in undergraduate studies in relevant subjects.
- A high post-exemption level of English.
- Passing an interview.
- High performance on an entrance exam that includes an assessment of reading comprehension skills, verbal and written proficiency.
- Note: Native speakers of English with a degree from an academic institution where the language of instruction is English are exempt from proficiency courses.
- Candidates who have a degree in English Literature are expected to complete 6 hours in Linguistics.
- Candidates who have a degree in English Linguistics are expected to complete 6 hours in Literature.
- Candidates who have partially fulfilled the requirements of a degree in English and those who have studied for an academic degree taught in English are expected to complete 26 hours.
- In all cases, pre-requisite studies will include at least 6 hours of English language proficiency.
