דגשים לגבי פרסום הצעה לפתרון בחינת הבגרות באנגלית

1. הצעת הפתרון המפורסמת בזאת לבחינת הבגרות באנגלית היא דוגמה הכוללת כמה אפשרויות פתרון בתשובות הפתוחות והיא אינה ממצה. במהלך הבדיקה ייתכן שייעשו שינויים ו/או הרחבות באפשרויות התשובה שיתקבלו על-ידי מעריכי הבחינה.
2. הפתרון להלן מביא את עיקר הסוגיות המרכזיות שהיו טעונות ליבון במסגרת המבחן אך יודגש כי הוא איננו תשובה מלאה ומקיפה, המזכה בניקוד מלא. נדגיש כי ציון המבחן מורכב, מטבע הדברים, גם מגורמים נוספים שאינם מופיעים בפתרון זה, ובהם: רמת ההתבטאות וניסוח התשובה, הקפדה על כללי הדקדוק והכתיב, התמקדות בעיקר, התבססות נכונה וראויה על הטקסט ועוד.
3. אם יתברר שנפלה טעות בהצעת הפתרון, תפורסם בתוך זמן סביר הצעה מתוקנת, והצעת הפתרון המתוקנת תהייה המחייבת. **ט.ל.ח.** (טעות לעולם חוזר) פרסום הצעת הפתרון כפוף לטעויות, ואין בו כדי לחייב קבלת תשובה שגויה בידי מעריכי הבחינה.
4. בהתאם לחוזר מנכ"ל טוהר הבחינות – תשע"ה/9ד, נבחן בבחינת הבגרות מחויב לפעול בהתאם לנוהלי טוהר הבחינות כדי להבטיח הליך בחינות אמין, הוגן ושוויוני. אם יתעורר חשד להפרת טוהר הבחינות על ידי הנבחן, יחל הליך של **החשדת הבחינה**, כמפורט בחוזר.

A. THE TREASURE OF LEMON BROWN / Walter Dean Myer

1.	iv) tells Greg about his difficult childhood
2.	i) He was a famous singer.

4.	Greg thinks that a treasure is something worth a lot of money. / Greg doesn't believe that Lemon Brown has a treasure because he thinks that a homeless person couldn't have something worth a lot of money. <i>Supporting information:</i> Greg says, "If you have one [a treasure]." / Lemon Brown lives in an abandoned building. / He wears dirty shoes. / He wears layers of dirty coats. / His legs are wrapped in rags. / Greg saw him looking through the trash. / pulling clothes out of a Salvation Army box.
5.	<i>Possible thinking skill:</i> Explaining cause and effect Greg learns from Lemon Brown how important the relationship is between a father and a son. As a result, he now understands that his father wants the best for him. He now knows that his father lectures him about studying because his father loves him. <i>Supporting information:</i> Greg sees that even though Lemon Brown was not with his son most of his life he worked hard to send him money. / For Lemon Brown and his son the harmonica and newspaper clippings are valuable. / "What else a man got 'cepting what he can pass on to his son, or his daughter." / Greg smiled when he thought of the lecture his father would give him.

He reminds her of herself and she wants to teach him how to behave. <i>Supporting information:</i> She tells him to wash his face. / gives him food. / She tells him that she also had problems in her life when she was young. Today she has a job and a home. / She believes that he has no one take care of him. / that he is hungry. / She gives him money for shoes. / She tells him not to steal again.

11. A SUMMER'S READING / Bernard Malamud

This quote says that it's important for a child to have someone to help him succeed in life. In the story Mr. Cattanzara is George's "champion." He pushes George to get an education so he can have a better life. He wants to talk about the books after George has finished reading some. "We can shoot the breeze about them," he says.
