- 2013 UniTO starts to set up the new QA system as required by ANVUR
- 2015 UniTO volunteers for periodic accreditation; in November, the ANVUR Commission evaluates all quality requirements for UniTO
- **2016** UniTO receives the Final Report from ANVUR
- 2016 UniTO starts the follow up process
- 2017 Accreditation Decree by MIUR (Ministry of Education&Research)
- 2019 UniTO is currently still working on the follow up process

Roles of the QUALITY UNIT at UniTO

- ✓ Oversees the performance of the institutional QA procedures and supports all Departments, Programmes and the Governance
- ✓ Promotes teaching quality
- ✓ Ensures the information flow within UniTO (e.g. with the Evaluation Committee) and with external institutions (ANVUR)
- ✓ Monitors quantitative indicators and is responsible for dissemination of the results (Programmes, Evaluation Committee, ANVUR)
- ✓ Writes an annual report describing all activities



The UniTO QUALITY UNIT: actions to improve QA

- ✓ Involvement of all players
- ✓ Standard guidelines and procedures
- ✓ Training courses on QA and related matters
- ✓ Web procedures to handle documents
- ✓ Monitoring of quantitative indicators

- ✓ Developing students' awareness and involvement
