Hello, Jeff.

#### So, Rosie, where do you take tourists to in the USA?

Well, most tourists to the USA enjoy seeing famous places like New York City or Disney World. But I don't take them there -I take them to places that are *unusual* and are NOT famous.

#### Can you give us an example?

Sure. For example, I like to take people to an *unusual bookstore*. This bookstore is *far* from any of the big *cities*, and from *all* the *famous* places. It takes about *three hours* to get there from New York. The bookstore is on a large *farm*. Its name is *Books on the Farm*.

## A bookstore on a farm? That IS unusual. Who opened it there?

This store belongs to a man called Henry Mason. He used to live in New York, and had a bookstore there. A few years ago, he decided to live *outside* the city, but he wanted to *keep* his *bookstore*. So he found a *beautiful building* on a *farm*, and moved his bookstore there. The building is 200 years old, and it is *very large*.

#### And why do people travel so far to visit this bookstore?

Because it's like *traveling* to the *past*. In this bookstore there are *books*, *maps* and *pictures* that are more than *150 years old*. Just like in a *museum*, most things in this store are *rare and valuable*. But the *store* is also *very different* from a museum: in the *store*, you can *pick up and touch* everything you see.

#### And can anyone *buy* these rare things?

Yes, of course. The bookstore recently sold one very old book for over *100,000 dollars*. But visitors can *also* buy books that are *not* rare. And even when they don't *buy anything*, they like to *look* at all the books and maps. They ALWAYS find things that interest them.

# Three hours is a long ride just for a bookstore, even if it *is* unusual. Is there anything *else* for tourists to *do* in the area?

Oh yes! There are beautiful *gardens* near the bookstore, and they are *open* to *visitors* all year. There are *also* several *artists* living in the area. You can *visit* them in their homes and *buy* their *pictures*. In addition, there are many good *restaurants*. Tourists enjoy *all* these things very much. I *know* this because *most* of them *told* me that they *want* to *come back* again.

#### That DOES sound good. Well, thank you for coming, Rosie. And goodbye, everybody.
