Over 400 teachers participated in an online national conference on Tuesday 1st February, 2022, for English teachers of learners with special educational needs. The conference was the dreamchild of Dr. Tziona Levi, Chief Inspector of English and Aharona Gvaryahu, National Counselor for Students with Special Educational Needs. It was oriented towards Elementary and Junior High teachers of English in all possible settings and was the first conference - run by the National English Inspectorate - of its kind. Dr. Tziona Levi and Aharona Gvarvahu opened the conference and then Aharona interviewed Rivka Feiner, who is a regional special education and English counselor in the Greater Jerusalem District. They discussed guidelines, policies, challenges and wonders when planning and teaching learners with special educational needs.

Much appreciation goes to all conference presenters: Miriam Ben, Rivka Feiner, Sharon Kleinerman, Kerem Rina, Estelle Treiwis and Francine Widerker who addressed a plethora of relevant issues and practical tools for teachers of students with a variety of different needs.
