The change in Module E and in the COBE

Bagrut module E and vocabulary learning:
The 16481 E module will be replaced in the summer testing period of 2023.

• The 16471 E module with the focus on learned vocabulary and without the use of the e-dictionary during the test, will become compulsory for 11th grade students (those now in the 10th grade).

• As of summer period moed 2024, the 16481 test will be abolished (and the COBE will include a listening component in place of the listening comprehension in 016481. See existing model on the ITEST site by Matach).

Students who take the E pilot this year and next year - should take the COBE with the listening semel 16486 (4 points) or 16586 (5 points). This year's 10th graders will ALL have to take the COBE with the listening.

The tenth graders had the opportunity to practice the important skills they acquire in the English and Diplomacy classrooms, as they made new friends from different schools and backgrounds, presented and discussed photos, and finally created their own photo essays. These summit days are truly the definition of active, meaningful learning.

ATID Lod Model United Nations Face to Face Conference is Back -atidmun.com After a two-year hiatus following the Covid-19 pandemic, the Atid Lod MUN conference – AtidMUN – returned as a face-to-face conference for its seventh iteration. It marked the first face-to-face MUN conference in Israel in over a year and a half and included over 280 delegates and 30 committee chairs from 26 schools across Israel – 370 Delegates, Chairs and Admins.

It was a conference for delegates of all skill levels and MUN experience, providing opportunities for delegates to further their knowledge about global issues to be resolved, develop their critical and creative thinking, writing, persuasion, negotiation skills, and improve their public speaking process, on their way to assume the roles of the world leaders and diplomats. The delegates took part in 11 committees, ranging from United Nations committees, such as the Economic and Social Council, or the Security Council, to regional councils like the Arab League or the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation. They were tasked with solving urgent political and global issues, from xenophobia and racism to the illicit arms trade in the dark web, the impact of the climate change in less developed countries and even sustainable governmental debt-management in a post-Covid world.

Academic Consultants Daniel Gindis and Royee Nachlieli gave 4 master class workshops – leading the delegates through all the preparation stages.

We believe that AtidMUN VII Conference has advanced the Israeli MUN Community.
