<u>Visit the Site for Diplomacy and International</u> <u>Communication in English!</u>

The month of February was one of intense activity for Diplomacy students and their hard-working teachers. While tenth graders were occupied with learning photojournalism and putting it into practice at the World Press Photo Summit Day Events, many of the eleventh graders were taking part in debating competitions and Model United Nations conferences, and twelfth graders have been implementing leadership projects, conflict resolution projects, and translation portfolios.

Diplomacy Major Leadership Projects

In the twelfth grade, as students complete their three years of study in this 5-point major, they are each required to plan and implement a leadership project. This could be workshops on the topic of human rights for other classes in their school, writing and publishing a regular Diplomacy newspaper, or planning and holding a Model UN conference, involving committees on different topics, writing topic guides, inviting guest delegates, chairing committees, and much, much more. Some of the Diplomacy students' leadership projects have been so impressive, and they make us incredibly proud. These students leave the major ready to become leaders and change-makers in their communities. We have no doubt we will one day hear about great things Diplomacy graduates are doing.

Special education? Learning differences? Neurotypical? Neurodifferences?

What is really in a name? There seems to be some confusion regarding the identification of the learners in our classrooms. Israeli education is becoming more inclusive, we often have the sense that the disparity and the gaps between the learners that we have in our classes has grown over the years, and particularly during this COVID 19 pandemic. The more we know about our learners who seem to struggle, the more we will be able to make a positive difference in their accessibility to this wonderful, yet often confusing language that we try to teach.

Like snowflakes, NO two children are alike. Each child teaches us something new, and different about people and they often teach us about ourselves. A name or a label of a child does not tell us WHO the child is, or what the child is capable of and it often does not tell us specifically what is difficult or challenging for that child to learn how to do.

When we are told that the learner in our class has specific challenges it is extremely helpful to collect as much ongoing information possible, about that learner from the classroom teacher and the guidance counselor, or from the special education coordinator in our school. We know how to teach English, we know how to teach children, these people can give us additional information that can increase our sensitivities and our knowledge about how to do the best we can to reach our goals as EFL teachers.

Our goals as English teachers for all learners – is for our students to believe that they CAN learn English.



We would like them all to believe in their ability to learn English.

They will be in English classes for many hours of their lives, and they will hear and see English around them for many years to come. Hopefully, we can help them to associate the letters and the sounds with positive memories and experiences.

Our goals as English teachers are for all learners is to increase their ability to understand what they hear- to be able to distinguish words one from the other and to comprehend a language that even today is becoming increasingly important for all walks of life.

Our goal as English teachers for all learners is to increase accessibility to print- by helping to demystify the letters and sounds, the patterns, and words that they see – almost every day.

Our goals as English teachers are to help all learners move forward – our job is NOT to look back and wonder what came before us, but to guide onward.

Our goals as English teachers are to remember that, there is never – everyone, there is never – all, there is never **can't** and there is never – **NEVER!**

Now more than ever we must believe in the future.... and the donation that we can make to the future, by helping our students believe in their abilities to learn. Nothing does that like English!

In this little corner we will try, each month to share teachers' ideas or tools that may be useful for some of you to help our students who seem to struggle, or who seem to need us more than others, reach these goals.
