

Module E:


Students starting 10th grade this year will be required to take the new format of Module E exam starting Summer 2023.

Teaching Students who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing



A message from Naomi Epstein, National Counselor for Teaching English to Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students:

It has come to my attention that some teachers in junior high schools are no longer permitting their Deaf/hard-of-hearing students to use an electronic dictionary on classroom exams.

The Deaf/hard of hearing students who are eligible for all accommodations are permitted to use an electronic dictionary on exams in junior high school, high school AND on the new Module E exam.

Please make sure that the teachers on your staff receive this information.

The ABLE Kit: changes and adaptations

The ABLE KIT was designed to assess and diagnose basic reading skills and build intervention programs based on the results of mapping students specific skills.

As of the 2021-2022 school year, the ABLE KIT is digitalized and available to all elementary school teachers on the MOE moodle. It will no longer be sent to elementary schools throughout the country.

The kit comprises two sections:

The screening tool- to be administered to the whole class at the end of 4th grade or during the beginning months of 5th grade. The diagnostic tool—to be administered, following the screening tool, to those students who received low scores on sections of the screening tool, or those students who have inconsistent scores.

Preparation for COBE on Moodle!

The COBE Moodle Template has been updated and is again available for teachers to request copies (one per group/course you teach, and with your pupils already enrolled!).

Moodle offers practice in one digital environment. Using Moodle to practice for COBE is not restricted to school: Teachers (and pupils) can access the copy of the COBE Template anytime, and anywhere, using the Ministry of Education username and password to access the safe and secure environment. In other words, pupils can practice from home, and even do so using their Mobile device (though it is much better to practice using a PC).

Teachers can also check (and grade!) their pupils' recordings on Moodle. There is no need to ask pupils to use any application to submit their exams. It is all there on Moodle. Learn more:

Professional Development: Join a professional learning community. October is here and our 70 learning communities will open soon all over the country.


Most of our PLCs will be online with a few face-to-face sessions. Check options with your counselor or district inspector to find out which PLC is the best for you.

Chat Away Summer Program

155 Junior High and High School students participated in the Chat Away program during the summer months of this year to promote their spoken English skills. The ESRA organisation matched 140 of their native English speaking volunteers with students and the pairs met on zoom for 30 minutes each week and spoke to each other about a vast variety of relevant topics in English.

Dr. Tziona Levi, the Chief Inspector of English and Mr. Terry Morris, the National Chairman of ESRA expressed their sincere appreciation for the volunteers at an Appreciation Event on zoom in early September which was attended by approximately 80 volunteers, students and English teachers.

Thanks to the 28 English teachers who took the time during their summer vacation to submit their students' names initially and later, to follow up on their progress. The next installment of the Chat Away program, for which over 500 ESRA volunteers have been recruited, will continue into the current academic year, restarting in October, providing students from all sectors of Israeli society to enhance their oral English proficiency skills.
