International Women's Day – March 8

Historically, women have never had the same rights ¹ as men. Women have always had to fight to get their rights. Did you know that in the U.S. women received the right to vote only in 1920? Today, however, it seems that women are becoming more powerful. Consider the following facts regarding the status of women:

- 1. Women earn² less than men; the average³ monthly salary⁴ in Israel for women in 2017 was NIS 8,188, for men it was NIS 11,928.
- Men usually hold the most powerful jobs.
- 3. In the Israeli parliament (Knesset) today, there are only 35 women out of 120 members!
- 4. Around the world, 65 million girls do not even go to school!
- 5. 70% of the poor people in the world are women.
- 6. 65% of the world's illiterate ⁵ are women.

It seems that the road to real equality ⁶ between men and women is still a long one.
