What is Fast Fashion?

Fast fashion describes a style of clothing that is produced quickly and cheaply. Many people buy fast-fashion clothes because they want to look stylish without spending a lot of money. Stores create new designs every few weeks, so there is always something new to buy.

The Impact on the Environment

Fast fashion has many negative effects on the environment. First, it uses a lot of water. For example, making just one t-shirt can require up to 2,700 liters of water. This is a huge amount, especially in places without enough water. Second, producing these clothes often involves chemicals that can pollute rivers and oceans. These chemicals can harm fish and other animals.



Waste and Throwaway Culture

Another problem with fast fashion is that it encourages people to throw away clothes quickly. Many people wear a piece of clothing only a few times before they get rid of it. This creates a lot of waste. In fact, millions of tons of clothing are thrown away every year.

How We Can Help

To help the environment, we can make better choices when buying clothes. Instead of buying many cheap items, we can buy fewer, higher-quality clothes that last longer. We can also recycle or donate old clothes instead of throwing them away. By being more thoughtful about our clothing choices, we can reduce the negative effects of fast fashion and protect our planet.

Follow-Up

Project: "Sustainable Fashion Collage"
