2. Synonyms & Vocabulary Expansion

Objective: Build vocabulary by finding synonyms for key words in the lyrics.

Instructions:

- Choose key words from the song (e.g., happy, clap, truth, level, sunshine, balloon).
- Have students work in pairs or groups to find synonyms.
- Example: Happy → joyful, cheerful, delighted, ecstatic
- Discuss how word choice affects meaning and tone.

3. Discussion & Reflection: What Makes You Happy?

Objective: Encourage speaking skills and personal connections to the song.

Instructions:

- Play the song and discuss the lyrics.
- Ask: What does happiness mean to you?

- Possible prompts:

- Perform their versions for the class!

5. Mood & Music Analysis

Objective: Explore how music conveys emotions.

Instructions:

- Discuss how the song's **rhythm**, **melody**, **and lyrics** create a happy mood.
- Ask:
 - What instruments do you hear?
 - How does the beat make you feel? Which vocabulary contributes to this?
 - Why do you think this song became so popular?
