Hello everyone. Today I'll be talking to Debbie Stern, who has a flower farm in the north of Israel, and grows tens of thousands of flowers every year. Recently, she's made some big changes to her business, and she'd like to tell us about them. Hi, Debbie.

Hello.

Debbie, can you please start by telling us what changes you've made on your flower farm?

Gladly. The first thing we did was get rid of all the greenhouses — you know, those special houses made of glass or plastic that you often see on flower farms. In our greenhouses, we used to grow very rare flowers that need special conditions, like extra heat and extra light. But now all our flowers are grown outside in the fields. Of course, we can't grow the same types of flowers that we had in the greenhouses, so now we have only flowers that grow easily outside.

Why did you get rid of the greenhouses?

Well, this is the first of several changes that we've made. Basically, there's one idea behind what we've done: We're trying to grow flowers in a way that doesn't cause so much damage to the environment. We decided to stop growing flowers in greenhouses, where we used a lot of electricity for heat and light. But growing flowers in the fields can demand a lot more water than we used in the greenhouses, so we chose flowers for our fields that don't have that problem. And most importantly, we now sell our flowers only in Israel.

Is that a change? Haven't you always done that?

Oh no — selling in Israel is a huge change for us! You see, we used to sell all our flowers abroad, in Europe and America, where people pay a lot of money to have rare flowers all year round. The flowers were sent there by airplane, and of course airplanes cause pollution. Perhaps Now our flowers arrive in shops here in Israel just a few hours after we pick them.

Wow – that sounds great!

Yes it is — especially since the flowers look beautiful much longer than ones that travel halfway round the world. But Israelis don't even have to wait for our flowers to arrive in the shops: Lately we've started allowing people to come to our farm to pick their own flowers. You won't believe how popular this activity has become! Families come from all over Israel. They bring food and drink with them, and happily spend several hours on the farm.
