







#### Use your plate - then eat it!

Many of us often use plastic cups and plates for picnics and parties. Then we throw them in the garbage. But plastic is not good for the environment, because it can take more than 500 years to decompose\*.



That's why people began to look for ways to make cups and plates that are edible\*\* – that means that you can actually eat them. And if you don't want to eat your cups and plates, that's okay too. You can throw them away and they will

decompose very quickly.

One of the first people to invent edible cups and plates was Richard Williams. In 1998 he started a company in New Zealand called Potatopak. Potatopak makes cups and plates out of potatoes. They come in many different colors, are stronger than those made out of plastic and can be used for hot or cold food and drinks. You can eat them, but they do not taste very good. Only animals, like cows, actually enjoy eating them.

In 2004, in Poland, Jerzy Wysocki made edible cups and plates from wheat\*\*\*. Wheat is brown, and all the cups and plates are this color, but you can buy them in many different shapes and sizes. At present the cups can only be used with cold drinks.

Even though edible cups and plates are sold in some shops, they are more expensive than plastic ones. However, if we care about the environment, we should choose to use them instead of plastic ones whenever we have parties or picnics.

# The Success of Alice's Adventures in Wonderland

Alice's Adventures in Wonderland is one of the most famous children's books in the world. Written by Charles Dodgson over 150 years ago, it immediately became popular with readers of all ages. Translated into almost 200 languages, and selling over 100 million copies, the book tells the story of Alice, a 7-year-old girl, who enters a strange world where animals and objects can talk. However, her unusual adventures are not the only reason that Alice's Adventures in Wonderland became such a success.

The book was more than just a story. It included mathematical questions and different riddles\*, which interested both children and adults. Charles Dodgson was a math teacher who wrote many serious math books for teachers¹. *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* gave him an opportunity to introduce the readers of his children's books to mathematical ideas. Even today, some readers still discuss how to solve the problems in the book.

Furthermore, readers of *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* loved reading about Alice, the main character in the book. She was a child who was not afraid to express strong opinions. It is important to remember that at the

time the book was published\*\*, children never argued with adults. Dodgson was the first author to create a character like Alice, and after his book was published, other authors also started to write about children who argued with adults.

Dodgson was delighted\*\*\* that the success of his book actually changed how people expected children to behave. Its success also meant that Dodgson was recognized wherever he went. This made him unhappy because he was a very private person. He even told a friend that he wished he had never written the book. However, all his readers are very grateful that he did. Even now, it still appears in lists of the top ten favorite children's books of all time.
