On October 7, 2023, when Israel was unexpectedly attacked, Menachem Kalmanson took the initiative to travel independently with his brother Elhanan and nephew Itiel to the Gaza border area. Their goal was to save civilian lives. Together, they managed to rescue approximately one hundred residents of Kibbutz Be'eri. Tragically, during the rescue operation, Menahem's brother, Elhanan, was fatally wounded in a terrorist attack. Image by Ministry of Education





Civilian Heroes: The 2024 Israel Prize for Bravery During Crisis

Menahem Kalmanson, a member of the heroic "Elhanan Team," was honored at the Israel Prize ceremony for his bravery in rescuing over 100 people from Kibbutz Be'eri during the October 7th attack. Tragically, his brother, Elhanan, lost his life in the battle after 16 hours of fighting. The following are excerpts from Kalmanson's moving speech:

"This event answers the question "What is our purpose here?", a question that echoed throughout the past year as division and dispute raged in the country and threatened to tear us apart from within. The question "Are we still brothers?" continued to echo until the sirens sounded on Simchat Torah and our enemies came out to attack and destroy us.

"On Shabbat afternoon my older brother Elhanan, whose absence I deeply feel at this moment, called my nephew Itiel and me to go with him to the south. Despite the risk and fear, he chose to go in time and time again. We didn't question our actions; our sole focus was that 'We must find our people'. In the middle of the night we were already very tired but we couldn't stop, as Itiel said "When you know your brother is in danger you do not really have a choice."

"When we got to the home of the Meir family in Be'eri, Michal refused to open the protected room door (Mamad). She begged from behind the door "Speak so that I can hear your Hebrew" and she didn't open the door until I cried "Shma Yisrael Hashem Elokeinu Hashem Echad" and only then the door opened. I admit, it wasn't a prayer it was a cry: I'm a Jew, I'm here for you, please open the door." This cry for unity, echoed around the region that day as thousands of soldiers went out of a sense of deep responsibility and endangered their lives for their brothers. Others who also helped felt the same sense of brotherliness and mutual fate."

"Elchanan was aware of our nation's challenges and weaknesses and and still chose to go into the danger because he believed that our people deserve this. In the last few months as disagreement arose again, we met families from diverse backgrounds. Despite differing views, everyone shared concerns for the country, lives, and hostages. We listened, debated, connected and felt love which, led us to humility. Like all family bonds, it's hard to explain what makes your brother so special and why you cannot replace him, as he is a brother."

Kalmanson concluded the speech by saying that "As the blood of our brothers cries out from the ground, we cannot continue to fight without seeing the good in this nation, for we are our brother's keeper."
