

On December 17, 1903, on the beaches of Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, the world's first airplane lifted off and changed the world forever. ... 



The Morse Code

Morse Code is named after Samuel F. B. Morse (1791-1872), code that gives a set of dots and dashes to each letter of the English alphabet. It was first used in 1836.
