### Instructions:

**Part One:** The teacher can send the questions below by email, photocopy them for pick up, or read them to the students over the phone. If the lesson is in class, then it is best to cut up the questions into cards – see the cards below.

By phone, it is easiest to play in pairs. In school, students can play in groups of up to six students. Each pair/group should choose 10 questions for everyone to answer. They should mark down their own answers and their friend's on a page in their Long Distance learning file to be given in to the teacher upon return to learning in school.

**Part Two:** additions to the game if it is played in class:

1. After everyone has answered, two groups get together to share the answers of their original group. Every girl should share the answers of two questions that they discussed. For one question she should explain her own answer and for the other question she should share her friend's answer.
2. After everyone answered the questions, the student walks around the room speaking with his classmates about their responses. He tries to find other students who said the same answers as he. He gets a point for every friend who has the same answer.
