PART I: ACCESS TO INFORMATION FROM WRITTEN TEXTS (70 points)

Read the text below and then answer questions 1-7.

JANE'S JOURNEY

Half a century after she began studying chimpanzees in Africa, Jane Goodall is back home in England. But this doesn't mean that the famous zoologist is living a quiet life. On the contrary. Now 76 years old, Goodall spends her days travelling all over the world, trying to convince people to become environmental activists.

5 As a child Goodall loved animals and always dreamt of living in a faraway land, observing wild animals and learning about their behaviour. Then, in her early twenties, she took a boat to Africa, planning to stay with a friend for a few months. While she was there she met the world-famous naturalist Louis Leakey. Impressed by her enthusiasm and intelligence, Leakey offered Goodall a job observing chimpanzees
10 in their natural surroundings. "I couldn't believe my luck," she says. "It was such a wonderful opportunity." She happily accepted Leakey's offer, and ended up staying in Africa for almost 40 years.

In 1986 Goodall's life completely changed direction. While attending a conference, she learned about the extent of the ecological crisis threatening the planet. "When I
15 realized how serious the situation was, I felt I had to do something," she says. "But I knew even then that there is no use fighting to save the environment if the next generation doesn't carry on the struggle." So in 1991 Goodall started an organization which is dedicated to getting youngsters involved in local conservation projects. Thanks to her tireless efforts, it now has tens of thousands of members in over 100
20 countries worldwide.

This year marks fifty years since Goodall began her scientific work. In honour of the occasion, a major TV series has been made about her achievements, and a film about her life will be shown in cinemas around the world. Its title, *Jane's Journey*, perfectly sums up the story of this remarkable woman.
